

India Medical Visa

In November 2014, the Government of India introduced an online tourist Visa (e-Visa) for 43 countries. This was done to promote travel to India, reducing time spent at border control and eliminating the necessity of visiting the embassy. The following year, India rolled out its e-Visa program for other major world countries. In April 2017, India retooled its e-Visa program, introducing a special visa subcategory for medical travellers.

At present, medical travellers from more than 160 countries can apply for a Medical e-Visa. Travelers who use the Medical e-Visa program apply, pay a fee online, and receive their electronic visa online all before traveling to India. Unlike the Tourist and Business e-Visas, medical travellers can enter the country up to **Triple Entry** with the e-Visa. The process has really simplified things for medical travellers who are seeking vital treatment in India.

- **Applicant Photo**
- **Passport Personal Details Scan**
- **Last Page of Passport (if applicable)**

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- The Indian Medical e-Visa allows for **Triple Entry**
- The Indian Medical e-Visa is valid for **60 days after arrival**. You can enter India on any date within this period.
- The visa holder can stay in the territory of the country for no more than **60 days in Total**.
- The applicant should carry a copy of the Indian visa along with him/her at the time of travel.
- The Indian Medical e-Visa is valid for entry through **26 designated Airports** (i.e. Ahmedabad, Amritsar, Bagdogra, Bengaluru, Calicut, Chennai, Chandigarh, Cochin, Coimbatore, Delhi, Gaya, Goa, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Kolkata, Lucknow, Madurai, Mangalore, Mumbai, Nagpur, Pune, Tiruchirapalli, Trivandrum, Varanasi & Vishakhapatnam) and **5 designated seaports** (i.e. Cochin, Goa, Mangalore, Mumbai, Chennai). However, travellers can **exit** from any of the authorized Immigration Check Posts (ICPs) in India.

- The Indian Medical e-Visa is non-extendable.
- Your passport should have at least six months validity from the date of arrival in India, and two blank pages.
- Nationals of Yellow Fever affected countries must carry a **yellow fever vaccination card** at the time of arrival in India, otherwise they may be quarantined for 6 days upon arrival in India.
- Applicants must arrive using the same passport with which they used when applying for the Medical e-Visa.

Three Step Regular Visa Application Process

Apply Online

Fill and Submit Visa Application Form Securely.

Submit Documents

Submit your application with required documents at Indian Visa Application Center or at Indian Mission.

3

Receive Passport, visa

Collect your passport/visa from Indian Mission/Visa Application Center or by post.

Medical Assistant Visa

A Medical Assistant Visa is given to those who are accompanying a patient. Maximum of two assistants are permitted with a patient. Visa is granted coterminous with the visa of the patient. Registration with Foreigners Regional Registration Office (FRRO) is required within 14 days of arrival in India if the stay is more than 180 days.

Documents required

- Signed printout of the online filled application form. In case of Minors (Under 18 years of age) both parents must sign the Declaration part on visa application form
- Two photographs size 2" x 2" inch (51 x 51mm) one uploaded with online application. **Do not staple/pin the other photograph**
- Original passport with minimum validity of 6 months and at least two blank pages on the passport
- Visa fees – Visa fee and Bank account information will be given after submission of application
- Letter from doctor/hospital certifying the requirement of an attendant.
- Documents relating to the medical treatment of patient
- Recent utility bill or Bank statement with name and address of applicant printed on it for proof of residence in Iceland (only for non-Icelandic passport holders)

Medical Requirements:

A certificate of preliminary medical advice from the country of origin/country of residence that shows the applicant has been advised to go for specialized medical treatment. In cases where the applicant desires to go for treatment under the Indian system of Medicine, the case may also be considered.

Proof of Sufficient Funds:

Residents in San Francisco jurisdiction: Applicants with occupation of Student, Retired or Unemployed; three most recent bank statements are recommended.

Other Requirements:

Houston: If you are a U.S. citizen who was born overseas, you must provide a Consular Report of Birth Abroad certificate.

Country of Origin:**Persons of Indian Origin Only:**

If you are of Indian origin you are required to renounce your Indian citizenship in order to apply for an Indian visa. Please note that Travisa cannot submit your request for a visa without the renunciation certificate. You must provide proof your of renunciation as one of the following:

- A Certificate of Renunciation issued by a Consulate of India
- An Indian passport containing a stamp of renunciation

For applicants of Pakistani origin: Travisa cannot submit an Indian visa application for Pakistani citizens and applicants of Pakistani origin. These applicants are required to submit visa applications in person.
